

Styling your web application

- You'll need...
 - to understand how the framework works
 - good knowledge of CSS
 - Understand the CSS Box Model
 - a few tools
 - be persistent


"dimensions of a block element are calculated by width, height, padding, borders, and margins"




- High Contrast & Web Crème
 - Playing around with the framework
 - Trying to understand the framework

 - ... I finally got it!




- Defined a style
- Created a color chart



Created Photoshop mockups (partially) because in browser is quicker





- CSS only (except the icons)
- Cross browser checked
- Beautified the GUI with CSS3
- Checked final results
- Delivered



What you **shouldn't** do

- Disturb the framework positioning
 - Don't use positioning
 - Randomly add paddings, margins, borders

Apply CSS hacks



What you **should** do

- Know what you're doing
 - Create a mockup or hire someone to do it for you
 - Create a color chart
 - Create a color palette (ColorPic)
- Disable browser cache
- Use your skills and learn along the way
- Be creative and experiment

Make sure you apply styles to the correct Id or Class

use **Firebug** to find the

right one






